Once a worker suffers disability, disease or death, although critically important, no amount of compensation will ever put things right. This is why in addition to fair compensation, workers and their representatives worked for and won worker health and safety rights and employer responsibilities in law, and why they yet insist on:

- Enforcement of health and safety laws when they go unobserved in the workplace
- Quality training focused on workplace hazards and not worker behaviours
- Specific regulations and standards in support of proper enforcement and training
- Sufficient, trusted resources to improve working conditions when needed.



On April 28, our National Day of Mourning for workers injured, killed or made ill because of uncontrolled workplace hazards, let's prioritize primary prevention and all those elements needed to ensure the safe and healthy work working people deserve.



By law, employers must provide their workers with general and job specific instruction and training including:

- WHMIS-GHS
- Worker Awareness
- Working at Heights
- Safe Lockout-Tagout
- Confined Space Entry
- JHSC Certification Parts I & II
- Certification Refresher training
- Transportation of Dangerous Goods
- Workplace Violence and Harassment
- Mobile Equipment Operator Competency.
