

Need to comply? Want to ensure learning? WHSC CAN HELP!

alls from heights are the leading cause of traumatic death and critical injury in the construction sector. In an effort to help stop this suffering, Ontario health and safety law was altered back in April, 2015 requiring employers to ensure untrained or inadequately trained workers on construction projects complete a **Ministry of Labour-approved working at heights** (WAH) training program. In fact, this mandatory training must be completed before they start work at heights and use fall protection equipment. Since October 1, 2017 this mandatory training is **required for all workers** regardless of the adequacy of previous training.

WAH training though is **only valid for three years** from the date of successful completion. **For continued compliance**, employers must ensure workers complete Ministry-approved WAH refresher training prior to the expiration of this three-year period. For many, **this expiry date is fast approaching**.
