Mandatory health and safety training obligations for employers have expanded significantly over the past year. And Ministry of Labour (MOL) inspectors are visiting workplaces seeking confirmation of compliance.

For instance, MOL inspectors issued almost 1,100 orders during the six month period ending January 18, 2015 calling on employers to ensure supervisors complete a health and safety awareness training program within one week of beginning work as a supervisor. They also issued more than 1,600 orders over this same period mandating employers to meet a similar obligation for worker awareness training. These new employer training obligations became law on July 1, 2014.

Employer training obligations are about to change again.

As of April 1, 2015, new requirements will come into force calling on employers to ensure untrained workers on construction projects complete a MOL-approved working at heights training program before using a fall restricting system, fall arrest system, safety net, work belt or safety belt.

Beginning June 1, 2015, employers will need to turn their attention to training or retraining workers and supervisors to comply with the GHS-related amendments to the *Occupational Health & Safety Act* (the Act) and WHMIS regulations. The new Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals, commonly referred to as GHS, establishes a new globally-recognized set of rules for classifying and labelling chemicals.

These new requirements are in addition to the many other legal training obligations for employers, including:

- Joint Health & Safety Committee (JHSC) Certification (Part I & II)
- Violence and Harassment
- Confined Space Entry
- Mobile Equipment Operator Competency, and
- Supervisor Competency.




