Hazard Awareness Training

Individual hazard awareness programs are delivered over a three hour session. When bundled, three separate programs can be delivered during a one day session. Each program is designed to satisfy the Part II Certification workplace-specific hazard training requirement, where workplaces opt to take a more customized approach. As a second option, workplaces can enroll in WHSC *Certification Part II Manufacturing* sector program which meets the needs of workplaces typical in this sector. It also allows workplaces to get into compliance fast. Each of the following modules is also suitable for general workforce training.
