



Need to get into compliance fast?

Falls from heights are the leading cause of traumatic death and critical injury in the construction sector. In an effort to help stop this suffering, Ontario health and safety law was altered back in April, 2015 requiring employers to ensure untrained or inadequately trained workers on construction projects complete a **working at heights** (WAH) training program approved by the Ministry of Labour's Chief Prevention Officer. In fact, this mandatory training must be completed before they start work at heights and use fall protection equipment. Since October 1, 2017 this mandatory training is **required for all workers** regardless of the adequacy of previous training.

WHSC Working at Heights training was one of the first to receive **approval**. Our comprehensive one-day course is designed to ensure critical learning takes place. After successfully completing our program, participants receive a WHSC record of training card **valid for three years**.* And because WHSC keeps all records of training, WHSC can provide replacement cards and complete training transcripts upon request.
