Returning home safely after a day's work is something most take for granted. Sadly, every day in Ontario workplaces large and small, workers are injured, made ill, or killed as a result of unsafe, unhealthy work.

Fortunately, workplaces also hold the potential to end these preventable tragedies.

Quality training works

Ontario health and safety law defines important rights, duties and responsibilities for everyone in the workplace. Workers Health & Safety Centre (WHSC) believes training plays a central role in workplace prevention efforts. Health and safety law recognizes its value too. Ontario employers have a general duty to provide information, instruction and supervision to workers to protect their health and safety as well as many specific training obligations.

Where to begin? Start by ensuring everyone in the workplace is adequately trained. This is easier with mandatory health and safety training programs *and* standards. **Effective and enforceable training standards** help prevent workplace tragedies and support those seeking consistent, quality training, as well as those looking to fulfill *all* their legal responsibilities.

Since April 1, 2015, employers must ensure untrained or inadequately trained **workers on construction projects complete a Ministry of Labour-approved working at heights training program** before using a fall restricting system, fall arrest system, safety net, work belt or safety belt.

As of June 1, 2015, employers also must **train or retrain workers and supervisors to comply with the GHS-related changes to WHMIS regulations**. The new Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS) sets out new rules for classifying and labelling hazardous chemicals.



Recently revised joint health and safety committee Certification Program Standards also took effect March 1, 2016.

Additionally, employers have many existing training obligations, including providing training on:

- Violence and Harassment
- Confined Space Entry
- Mobile Equipment Operator Competency, and
- Supervisor Competency.

Another long awaited standard is for mandatory training comparable to JHSC Certification training for **worker representatives in small workplaces**. Small businesses, a special focus of Ministry of Labour enforcement activity, make up 95 per cent of Ontario employers and employ 28 per cent of Ontario workers. WHSC already has a program for small workplaces which meets this very need.

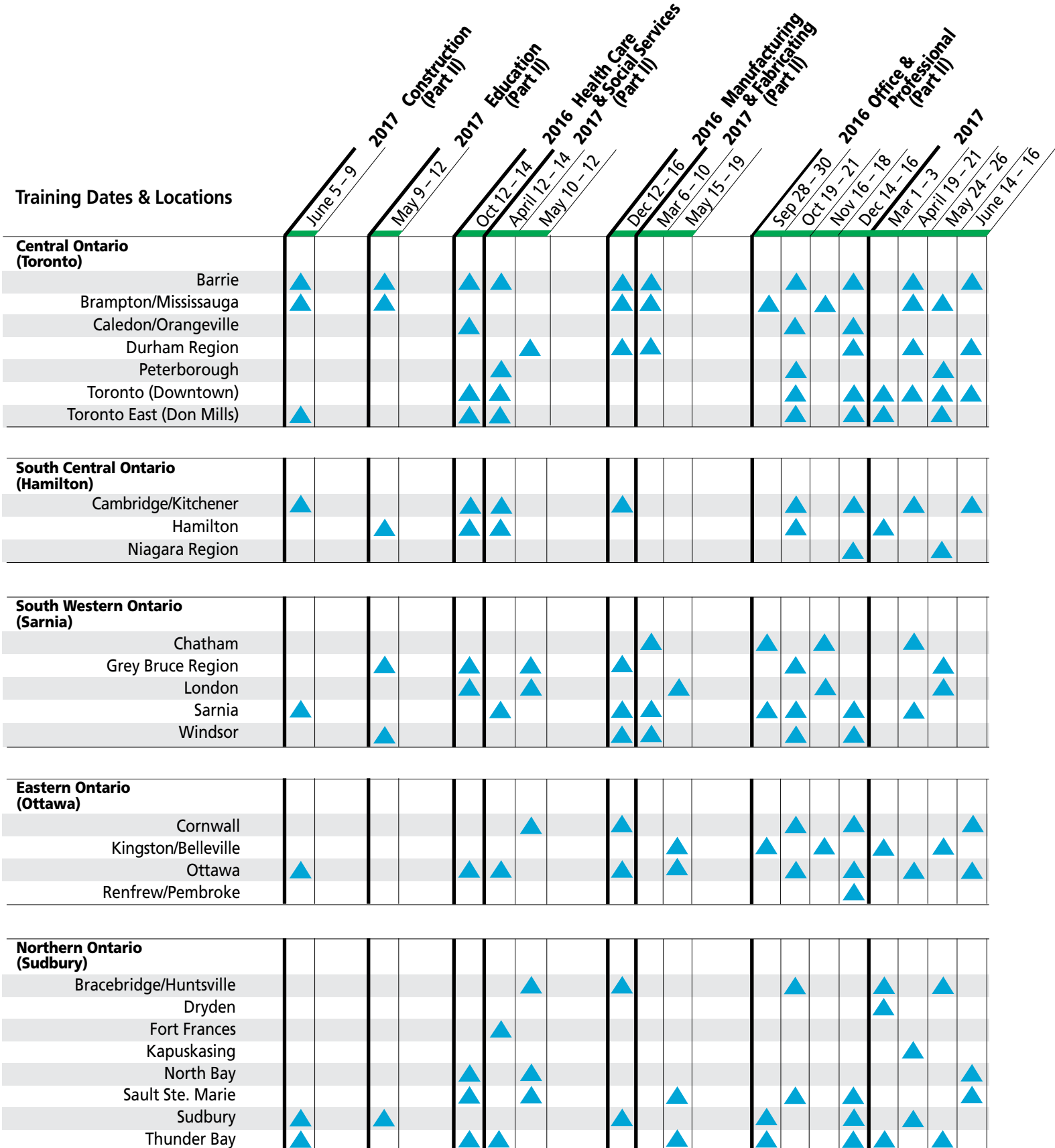
